

GUIDE TO FAIR PLAY MARKS

It is very important that you award the opposition teams an appropriate mark and submit this on your Match Report (Results).

The table below should act as a guide for the overall mark which should fall within the mark range.

When completing the Fair Play Marks, they are out of 10.

10	No incidents on or off the field including towards the referee. Respect totally adhered to and opposition team welcoming.
7-9	No incidents on or off the field including towards the referee. Respect generally adhered to.
5-6	No incidents on or off the field. Respect loosely adhered to, but the Refereeing was openly questioned negatively. (Referee may be approached for a report)
3-4	1-2 negative incidents on or off the field took place. Respect not adhered to, and Refereeing was possibly questioned negatively. (A report to League or County will be requested)
0-2	3 plus negative incidents on or off the field took place or a serious incident of welfare/safeguarding occurred involving a child. Respect not adhered to, and Refereeing was openly and negatively questioned. (A report to the League and County is compulsory)

Notes

- Always try to be objective when marking. You may not obtain the most objective view by marking immediately after the game.
- Judge the overall behaviour during the whole game focusing on "behaviour on and off the field" and "Respect". Don't be too influenced by one particular incident.
- If there are any serious safeguarding, welfare or misconduct incidents at the match and you wish to speak about what has happened then you are welcome to call or email the Welfare Officer, or League Secretary, Dawn Wapples who will discuss the match with you.
